1. Introduction

This information manual ("Manual") provides an outline of the types of records held by The Math Machine and explains how one may submit Requests for access to these records in terms of the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 ("PAIA", "Act").

This Manual has been prepared in accordance with Section 51 of the Act, giving effect to everyone's constitutional right of having access to information held by private sector bodies (i.e. companies) or public bodies (i.e. Government institutions) where such access is needed for the exercise and/ or protection of the Requester's rights; this Manual aims to facilitate Requests for access to the relevant or applicable records.

2. Definitions And Interpretation

2.1. Unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder -

- 2.1.1. "**Competent person**" means any person who is legally competent to consent to any action or decision being taken in respect of any matter concerning a child;
- 2.1.2. "**Data Subject**" means the person to whom personal information relates;
- 2.1.3. "**Data Subject Request**" means a request by a Data Subject as allowed under POPIA;
- 2.1.4. "**Form 2**" means Form 2 in Annexure 1 attached hereto which is prescribed by regulation to be used to request access to Records held by a public or private body (such as Records held by The Math Machine); "**Guide**" means the [PAIA Guide](#), as amended, made in pursuance of section 10 of PAIA, which seeks to assist a person in exercising any right they might have as contemplated in both PAIA and POPIA;
- 2.1.5. "**Information Officer**" means the person acting on behalf of The Math Machine and discharging the duties and responsibilities assigned to the head of The Math Machine by the Act. The Information Officer is duly authorised to act as such, with such authorisation having been confirmed by the head of The Math Machine in writing;
- 2.1.6. "**Information Regulator**" means the Information Regulator established in terms of section 39 of POPIA;
- 2.1.7. "**Manual**" means this manual published in compliance with Section 51 of the Act;
- 2.1.8. "**PAIA**" means the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000, as amended from time to time;
- 2.1.9. "**PAJA**" means the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act 3 of 2000, as amended from time to time;
- 2.1.10. "**POPIA**" means the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013, as amended from time to time;
- 2.1.11. "**Privacy Policy**" means the policy that explains how The Math Machine Processes Personal Information as published on the The Math Machine website or as available from the Information Officer;
- 2.1.12. "**Record**" means any recorded information, regardless of form or medium, which is in the possession or under the control of The Math Machine, irrespective of whether or not it was created by The Math Machine;
- 2.1.13. "**Request**" means a Request for access to a Record held by The Math Machine;
- 2.1.14. "**Requester**" means any person whether South African or non-South African, including a public body or an official thereof, making a Request for access to a Record held by The Math Machine and includes any person acting on behalf of that person;
- 2.1.15. "**Responsible Party**" means a public or private body or any other person which, alone or in conjunction with others, determines the purpose of and means of processing personal information;
- 2.1.16. "**SAHRC**" means the South African Human Rights Commission;
- 2.1.17. "**SARS**" means the South African Revenue Service; and
- 2.1.18. "**The Math Machine**" means The Math Machine (Pty) Ltd with registration number 2017/024385/07.

2.2. Unless a contrary intention clearly appears, words signifying:

- 2.2.1. the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
- 2.2.2. any one gender includes the other genders and vice versa; and

2.2.3. natural persons include juristic persons.

2.3. Unless otherwise stated, terms defined in the PAIA and POPIA shall have the same meaning in this Manual.

3. Overview Of The Math Machine (Pty) Ltd

The Math Machine is a registered South African company founded in 2016 by Misha and Edward Sterni. Misha having a passion for maths and a love for kids and Edward having a superb business acumen, decided to combine their skills and to establish a maths tutoring brand offering a math tutoring/ lesson program which is able to relate and connect to a new generation of youth (see <https://www.themathmachine.co.za/about.php>). The Math Machine comprises of a main The Math Machine company and numerous franchised The Math Machine companies.

All learning material created by The Math Machine is created and moderated in-house. This enables The Math Machine to ensure a consistent level of material across The Math Machine network (including all franchisees). Learning material used during math lessons include booklets, presentations and online math tests/memos and videos which parents/guardians are able to access online via their online profile (created and activated once they acquire our services).

The Math Machine has an online presence through its website (<https://www.themathmachine.co.za/>) where it introduces and promotes various of its math tutoring services, math classes, programmes, branches and describes how you can become a franchisee, should you wish to do so.

The Math Machine's services are described more in detail below:

Where The Math Machine acts as owner of any outlet, The Math Machine services are:

3.1. Maths Classes

- 3.1.1. For grade 4-10 students in Afrikaans and English.
- 3.1.2. Classes are limited to 6 (six) students per session.
- 3.1.3. Maths Class sessions are 1 hour in duration and held Monday to Friday between 15:00-19:00.
- 3.1.4. Extra workshops are provided for, during exams.

3.2. Online Assistance

- 3.2.1. Students are provided with exclusive access to online learning material (including videos, tests and memos of curriculum-based topics).
- 3.2.2. All learning material is in line with (but not limited to) CAPS

Where the Math Machine acts as a Franchisor, The Math Machine services are:-

- 3.3. Management of Franchisees;
- 3.4. Central marketing functions, such as national marketing for the brand "The Math Machine"
- 3.5. Central administration functions, such as accounting

5. Guide to PAIA (Section 51(1)(b) read with section 10)

- 5.1. In terms of PAIA, a Requester may be granted access to records held by a private body. This access is subject to the records being required for the exercise or protection of any right. Should a public body lodge a complaint, in order to receive access, the public body must be acting in the public interest.
- 5.2. The Information Regulator has, in terms of section 10(1) of PAIA, as amended, updated and made available the revised Guide on how to use PAIA ("Guide"), in an easily comprehensible form and manner and to assist Data Subjects in knowing how to access their Personal Information in terms of 23 of POPIA, as may reasonably be required by a person who wishes to exercise any right contemplated in PAIA and POPIA.
- 5.3. The Guide is available in each of the official languages and in braille.
- 5.4. The Guide may be accessed, in the official language of your choice, on the Information Regulator's website ([Clink Link](#)). A copy of the Guide is also available (in English) for public inspection during normal office hours at the office/s of The Math Machine.
- 5.5. Requests for access to the Guide may also be made on a form that corresponds substantially with [Form 1](#) of Annexure 1 of this Manual, to the Information Regulator.
- 5.6. The aforesaid Guide contains, but is not limited to, the description of, -
- 5.6.1. the objects of PAIA, POPIA and PAJA;
 - 5.6.2. the manner and form of a request for access to a record of a private body contemplated in section 50 of PAIA;
 - 5.6.3. the assistance available from the IO in terms of PAIA and POPIA;
 - 5.6.4. the assistance available from the Regulator in terms of PAIA and POPIA;
 - 5.6.5. all remedies in law available regarding an act or failure to act in respect of a right or duty conferred or imposed by PAIA and POPIA, including the manner of lodging-
 - 5.6.5.1. an internal appeal;
 - 5.6.5.2. a complaint to the Regulator; and
 - 5.6.5.3. an application with a court against a decision on internal appeal or a decision by the Regulator or a decision of the head of a private body;

- 5.6.6. the notices issued in terms of section 54 regarding fees to be paid in relation to requests for access; and
- 5.6.7. the regulations made in terms of section 92.

6. Voluntary disclosure and automatic availability- Categories Of Records Available Without Having To Request Access (Section 51(1)(c))

- 6.1. Records that are automatically available to the public are:
 - 6.1.1. All records of The Math Machine lodged in terms of government requirements with various statutory bodies, including the Registrar of Companies, and the Registrar of Deeds.
 - 6.1.2. All records in booklets, brochures, pamphlets, and magazines (if any) published by The Math Machine or any of its agents, franchisees or representatives for distribution to the public relating The Math Machine services.
 - 6.1.3. News and other marketing information.
 - 6.1.4. All records on The Math Machine's website (<https://www.themathmachine.co.za/>).
- 6.2. A Requester may request a copy of a Record referred to under 6.1 and must be provided with such copy, upon payment of the fee for reproduction, as provided for in Items 2 to 8 of [Annexure 2](#) to this Manual.

7. Records Available In Terms Of Other Legislation (Section 51(1)(d))

- 7.1. The Math Machine is required to keep particular records, in terms of certain statutes. Insofar as may be applicable, The Math Machine keeps records of information to the extent required in terms of the following legislation, as amended, and codes of best business practice:

 - 7.1.21. Regulation of Interception of Communications and Provision of Communication-Related Information Act Revenue Laws Amendment Act 45 of 2003.

- 7.1.22. Skills Development Act 97 of 1998.
- 7.1.23. Unemployment Contributions Act 4 of 2002.
- 7.1.24. Unemployment Insurance Act 63 of 2001.
- 7.1.25. Value-Added Tax Act 89 of 1991.

7.2. Information and records held by The Math Machine in terms of any of the abovementioned legislation will be made available in terms of the provisions of the relevant legislation, but without prejudice to the provisions of the Promotion of Access to Information Act. The above list is non-exhaustive.

8. Types Of Records Held By The Math Machine (Section 51(1)(e))

The Math Machine maintains records on the following categories and subject matters. **Please note** that recording a category or subject matter in this Manual does not imply that a Request for access to such records would be granted. All Requests for access will be evaluated on a case by case basis in accordance with the provisions of PAIA and POPIA. Please further note that the below listed records are not exhaustive.

8.1. Personnel Documents and Records.

8.1.1. "Personnel" refers to any person who works for or provides services to or on behalf of The Math Machine, and receives or is entitled to receive remuneration and any other person who assists in carrying out or conducting the business of The Math Machine. This includes, without limitation, board members (executive and non-executive), all permanent, temporary and part-time staff, as well as contract workers, whom work for The Math Machine franchisor **OR** The Math Machine franchisee.

8.2. Client Related Records.

8.2.1. A "client" refers to any natural or juristic entity that receives services from The Math Machine, where the Math Machine operates a the Math Machine Outlet directly. These records include but are not limited to:

- 8.2.1.1. Records provided by clients in relation to the specific services required by the client, medical information and personal and/or special personal information, and in terms of the contractual arrangements between The Math Machine and clients.
- 8.2.1.2. Records generated by or within The Math Machine related to its clients, including transactional records.
- 8.2.1.3. Records pertaining to third-party information provided by clients.
- 8.2.1.4. Records provided by third parties in the course of doing business with The Math Machine.

8.3. Franchise Related Records.

8.3.1. A "Franchisee" refers to any natural or juristic entity that receives services from The Math Machine as Franchisor. These records include but are not limited to:

- 8.3.1.1. Records provided by Franchisees in relation to the specific services required by the Franchisees, for example identity documentation, CIPC documentation and other personal and/or special personal information related to the Franchisee, and in terms of the contractual arrangements between The Math Machine and the Franchisee.
- 8.3.1.2. Records generated by or within The Math Machine related to its Franchisees, including transactional records.
- 8.3.1.3. Records pertaining to third-party information provided by Franchisees.
- 8.3.1.4. Records provided by third parties in the course of doing business with The Math Machine.

8.4. Statutory Company Records/ Corporate Records.

- 8.4.1. Minutes of executive and other decision-making operational bodies.
- 8.4.2. Documents of Incorporation.
- 8.4.3. Memorandum and Articles of Association.
- 8.4.4. Minutes of Board of Directors' Meetings and Board sub-committee Meetings.
- 8.4.5. Franchise Agreements.

- 8.4.6. Delegations of authority.
- 8.4.7. Other statutory documents of a legal and commercial nature.

8.5. Other Records.

- 8.5.1. Documents relating to the operational, commercial and financial interests of The Math Machine.
- 8.5.2. Commercial and other legal contracts or agreements.
- 8.5.3. Client and other data bases.
- 8.5.4. Information on existing and past litigation.
- 8.5.5. Trade Mark and Intellectual Property applications and information.
- 8.5.6. Administrative Information.
- 8.5.7. Licenses.
- 8.5.8. Human Resources Information.
- 8.5.9. Insurance Policies.
- 8.5.10. Marketing records.
- 8.5.11. Internal and external correspondence.
- 8.5.12. Disaster recovery plans.
- 8.5.13. The Math Machine services records.
- 8.5.14. Internal policies and procedures.
- 8.5.15. Records held by officials of The Math Machine.

- 8.6. Where any of the above records contain Personal Information and a Request is submitted, the provisions of PAIA as well as POPIA will apply accordingly. Take note that: "Personal information", as defined in POPIA means information relating to an identifiable, living, natural person, and where it is applicable, an identifiable, existing juristic person, including, but not limited to those categories as defined in section 1 of POPIA [[POPIA](#) - Click on link to access POPIA].

9. Other Information As May Be Prescribed (Section 51(1)(f))

The Math Machine may possess records pertaining to other parties, including without limitation contractors, suppliers, subsidiary/ holding/ sister companies, The Math Machine franchises, joint venture companies and service providers. Alternatively, such other companies may possess records that can be said to belong to The Math Machine.

- 9.1. These records include but are not limited to:
 - 9.1.1. Personnel, customer or private records which are held by another party as opposed to the records held by The Math Machine.
 - 9.1.2. Records held by The Math Machine pertaining to other parties, including but not limited to, financial, commercial, operational and legal records, contractual records, correspondence, records provided by the other party, and records provided by third parties about contractors/ suppliers.

10. Processing of Personal Information (including Special Personal Information (Section 11, Sections 26 – 33) or Children Information (section 34 – section 35) in terms of POPIA

Processing of Personal Information be processed by The Math Machine in accordance with The Math Machine Privacy Policy.

11. Information Regulator

- 11.1. Section 39 of POPIA establishes the Information Regulator and amends the role of the SAHRC in relation to the PAIA mandate. All the functions of the SAHRC, as enumerated in PAIA, will now be handled by the Regulator. Section 40 of POPIA identifies the functions of the Regulator.
- 11.2. The Regulator is responsible for monitoring compliance with POPIA and PAIA and is tasked, amongst other powers, duties and functions, to handle complaints about the protection of personal information and access to information held by The Math Machine.
- 11.3. For complaints or general enquiries contact the Regulator using the contact information under [5.7.2 above](#).

12. Data Subject Participation and Information Officer Duties and Responsibilities under POPIA

This PAIA Manual as well as The Math Machine Privacy Policy gives effect to sections 23 and 55 of POPIA.

12.1. Section 23(1) of POPIA states that:

“A data subject, having provided adequate proof of identity, has the right to -

- (a) request a Responsible Party to confirm, free of charge, whether or not the Responsible Party holds Personal Information about the data subject;
- (b) request from a Responsible Party the record or a description of the personal information about the data subject held by the Responsible Party, including information about the identity of third parties, or categories of third parties, who have, or have had, access to the information-
 - (i) within a reasonable time;
 - (ii) at a prescribed fee, if any;
 - (iii) in a reasonable manner and format; and
 - (iv) in a form that is generally understandable.”

12.2. Section 55(1)(b) of POPIA refers to the duties and responsibilities of the Information Officer when Requests for information are made to The Math Machine. It reads as follows:

“An Information Officer’s responsibilities include dealing with Requests made to the body.”

ADDRESS YOUR POPIA RELATED DATA SUBJECT REQUEST AS PER OUR PRIVACY POLICY, ALTERNATIVELY TO OUR INFORMATION OFFICER AT THE CONTACT DETAILS AS STATED UNDER [4.2 above](#).

13. Steps To Consider Before Submitting A Request

13.1. STEP 1: The following steps must be considered before submitting a Request:

13.1.1. Please note that Section 7(1) states that:

“This Act does not apply to a record of a public body or a private body if –

- (a) that record is Requested for the purpose of criminal or civil proceedings;
- (b) so Requested after the commencement of such criminal or civil proceedings, as the case may be; and
- (c) the production of or access to that record for the purpose referred to in Paragraph (a) is provided for in any other law”.

13.1.2. If Section 7(1) applies, the Requester may not bring a Request in terms of this Act. The Requester must use the rules and procedures for discovery of information of the relevant legal forum and proceedings that he/ she is involved in.

13.1.3. The Math Machine reserves the right to claim all expenses and other damages incurred as a result of a Requester submitting a Request in contravention of Section 7(1).

13.2. STEP 2: Does the information Requested exist in the form of a record?

13.2.1. The Act only applies to documents that are in existence at the time of receiving the Request.

13.2.2. The Act does not compel anyone to create a record which is not yet in existence at the time the Request is made.

13.3. STEP 3: Is the document in the possession or under the control of The Math Machine?

13.3.1. The Act provides that the Requested record must be in The Math Machine’s possession or under its control. If the document is not in The Math Machine’s possession, the Requester must Request the record from the party under whose possession or control it is.

14. Electronic Communication

14.1. The provisions of the Electronic Communications and Transactions Act, 2002, are applicable to all forms, records, documents or any information, which are electronically communicated.

15. Access: Procedure, Availability And Prescribed Fees as per the PAIA

15.1. How to Request a Record (PAIA Section 53):

- 15.1.1. Requests for access to Records contemplated in section 53(1) of the Act, must be made on a form that corresponds substantially with [Form 2](#) of Annexure 1 to this Manual, to the Information Officer.
 - 15.1.2. The Information Officer must –
 - 15.1.2.1. assist a Requester with any Request with regards to a Request for access to information; and
 - 15.1.2.2. if a Request for access to information is made orally as a result of illiteracy or a disability of a Requester, complete [Form 2](#) of Annexure 1 to the Manual on behalf of the Requester and provide a copy thereof to the Requester, as contemplated in section 18(3) of the Act.
 - 15.1.3. The Request fee payable by every Requester referred to in section 54(1) of the Act, is prescribed in Item 1 of [Annexure 2](#) to the Manual.
 - 15.1.4. Failure to make use of the prescribed form could result in your Request being refused or delayed.
 - 15.1.5. Should the Information Officer be of the opinion that fulfilment of the Request will require more time than the prescribe hours, the Requester will be informed to pay a deposit, of no more than a third of the above Request fee. In the event that the Request is denied, the deposit will be refunded to the Requester.
 - 15.1.6. The Requester must provide sufficient detail on the Request Form to enable the Information Officer to clearly identify:
 - 15.1.6.1. The record(s) Requested.
 - 15.1.6.2. The Requester (positive proof of identification).
 - 15.1.6.3. The format of access required:
 - i. the postal address, email address and telephone number of the Requester in the Republic; and
 - ii. if the Requester wishes to be informed of the decision in any manner (in addition to written), the manner and particulars thereof.
 - 15.1.7. Access is not automatic. The Requester must therefore identify the right he/ she is seeking to exercise or protect and provide an explanation as to why the Requested Record is required for the exercise or protection of that right.
 - 15.1.8. If a Request is made on behalf of a person, the Requester must then submit proof, to the satisfaction of the Information Officer, of his/ her authority to make the Request. Failure to do so will result in the Request being rejected.
- 15.2. Decision on Request (Section 56):
- 15.2.1. The Requester will be notified, within 30 (thirty) days, in the manner indicated by him/ her of the outcome of his/ her Request, alternatively whether an extension not exceeding 30 (thirty) days is required to deal with the Request.
 - 15.2.2. If the Request for access is granted, a further access fee must be paid for the search, preparation and reproduction of the Records as well as for any time that has exceeded the prescribed hours to search and prepare the Record for disclosure. Access will be withheld until the Requester has made payment of the applicable fee(s).
 - 15.2.3. If the Request for access is refused, reasons for the refusal will be provided and the Requester will be advised that he/ she may lodge an application with a court against the refusal of the Request, as well as the procedure for lodging the application.
 - 15.2.4. The main grounds for refusal of a Request relates to:
 - 15.2.4.1. the unreasonable disclosure of personal information about a third party, including a deceased person (subject to section 63(2) of the Act);
 - 15.2.4.2. disclosure that could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of an individual;
 - 15.2.4.3. the disclosure that would likely prejudice or impair, inter alia -
 - i. the security of a building, structure or system, including but not limited to, a computer or communication system;
 - ii. a means of transport; or
 - iii. any other property;
 - 15.2.4.4. mandatory protection of the privacy of a third party who is a natural person, which would involve unreasonable disclosure of personal information of that natural person;

- 15.2.4.5. mandatory protection of commercial information of a third party, if the record contains:
 - i. trade secrets of that third party;
 - ii. financial, commercial, scientific or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interest of that third party; or
 - iii. information disclosed in confidence by a third party to The Math Machine, if the disclosure could put that third party at a disadvantage in negotiations or commercial competition;
- 15.2.4.6. mandatory protection of confidential information of third parties if it is protected in terms of any agreement;
- 15.2.4.7. mandatory protection of the safety of individuals and the protection of property;
- 15.2.4.8. mandatory protection of records which would be regarded as privileged in legal proceedings;
- 15.2.4.9. commercial activities of The Math Machine, which may include:
 - i. financial, commercial, scientific or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interest of The Math Machine;
 - ii. information which, if disclosed, could put The Math Machine at a disadvantage in negotiations; or
 - iii. a computer programme which is owned by The Math Machine and which is protected by copyright;
 - iv. the research information of The Math Machine or a third party, if its disclosure would disclose the identity of The Math Machine, the researcher or the subject matter and would place the research at a serious disadvantage; or
- 15.2.4.10. Requests for information which is clearly frivolous or vexatious, or which involve unreasonable diversion of resources.
- 15.2.5. The Requester may lodge an internal appeal or an application to court against the tender or payment of the Request fee.
- 15.3. The Information Officer must, if a Request for access to a Record referred to under [15.1.1](#) to [15.1.3 above](#) is granted or refused, inform the Requester of-
 - 15.3.1. his or her decision; and
 - 15.3.2. the fees payable as provided for in [Annexure 2](#) of the Manual: Provided that a Request for a copy of the Guide may not be refused.
- 15.4. A person who Requests-
 - 15.4.1. a copy of a Record contemplated under [6.1 above](#); or
 - 15.4.2. access to a Record as contemplated in [15.1.1](#) to [15.1.3 above](#) of the Manual, may be charged the fee for reproduction and postage as prescribed in [Annexure 2](#) of the Manual, if the Request is granted.
- 15.5. If-
 - 15.5.1. the search for the Record in respect of which a Request for access has been made; and
 - 15.5.2. the preparation of the Record for disclosure, including any arrangement contemplated in section 29(2)(a) and (b)(i) and (ii)(aa) of the Act, would, in the opinion of the Information Officer, require more than 6 (six) hours for these purposes, the Information Officer must, in a form that corresponds substantially with [Form 3](#) of Annexure 1 to this Manual, inform the Requester to pay a deposit, must not exceed one third of the amount payable, if the Request is granted.
 - 15.5.3. The fee for the search for and preparation of the Record contemplated in section 29(2)(a) and (b)(i) or 54(2)(a) and (b)(i) of the Act is provided for in Item 9 of [Annexure 2](#) to this Manual.
- 15.6. Records that cannot be found or that are lost:

15.6.1. If all reasonable steps have taken to find a Requested Record, and there are reasonable grounds to believe the Record is in The Math Machine's possession but cannot be found or does not exist, The Math Machine's Information Officer will notify the Requester, by way of affidavit or affirmation as prescribed by the Act, that it is not possible to give access to the Requested Record.

15.6.2. If, after notice is given as per 15.6.1 above, the Record is found, the Requester concerned must be given access to the Record, unless access is refused on any of the refusal grounds provided for in the Act.

15.7. Remedies Available when a Request is Refused:

15.7.1. The Math Machine does not have an internal appeal procedure.

15.7.2. Any decision made by the Information Officer is final.

15.7.3. Should the Requester not be satisfied, the Requester should exercise the external remedies provided for in the Act.

15.8. Limitation of Liability:

15.8.1. The Math Machine is relieved from liability and shall have no duty whatsoever in relation to:

15.8.1.1. the integrity or accuracy of the information Requested;

15.8.1.2. any delay associated with the delivery except to comply with the procedures stipulated herein; and/ or

15.8.1.3. that the information Requested will conform with the requirements of the Requester except that it should correspond with the title and description provided by the Requester.
